Our Charity: Headstart4Babies



As Chairman of the Pink Tie Club in its inaugural year, the privilege of choosing the first charity that we would support was a real honour and something that I have taken great delight in doing. My own association with Headstart4Babies came about through an advert that St Ives Town Football Club, of whom I am also the Chairman, placed in a local paper when looking for a charity shirt sponsor. We had a number of responses to our appeal and it was decided, following a ballot, that the Football Club would support another local charity. The Headstart4Babies story was very touching and I was keen that at my first opportunity I would endeavour to support the charity. Please give generously to the various fundraising initiatives that we have on offer today, especially the Auction (*see pages 9 and 10*).



Headstart4Babies is run by Philip Saich and Karen Laker, whose baby Ben was treated for severe plagiocephaly in 2004/2005. During Ben's treatment, Karen and Philip decided to set up a not-for-profit organisation to give families faced with the condition much-needed information about prevention and cure, and to raise money to help those less fortunate to access private helmet treatment.

Now a UK registered charity (number 1112256), Headstart4Babies aims to raise awareness of plagiocephaly and brachycephaly, conditions which are being diagnosed in an increasing number of babies. Plagiocephaly and brachycephaly can be treated using a non-invasive helmet and treatment is most effective between the ages of four and 12 months, as that is when the skull is experiencing its most rapid growth and is at its most malleable. Treatment in the UK costs a maximum of £2,500.

All donations received by Headstart4Babies are used to further its charitable objectives, which include raising awareness of plagiocephaly and its associated conditions, providing help and advice to worried parents and, where its funds permit, assisting families on low incomes to proceed with treatment. With its trustees the charity is also able to assist families in fundraising activities, both to benefit the charity and to fund treatment for their own baby. 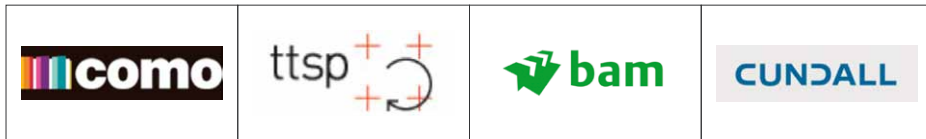


